Scarlett sat down, and the kids told Scarlett's parents everything.


"When we got to the lab, you were all lying there on the ground, so we drove you to the house," Scarlett's mom said.

"Well, you did," said Becca in a muffled voice.


"I said I'm sorry!" said Felisha, now crying too.

"Becca please. You don't need to like me, but please just help me!" asked Felisha desperately.


"You know what? I'm done," said Becca.

"I-In a t-town, I mean a vi-llage." said Felisha. "This is the worst day ever!" she said in tears.


Felisha ran off the stage right into Becca.




8th Grade High Schools by Alyssa Eggers




